### <u>Homework</u>

Your child will receive homework each week on a Thursday. This will need to be returned on Tuesday.

#### Home Reading

It is really important that you listen to your child read at home at least 3 times per week and sign their reading diary.

### **Accelerated Reader**

All children in school take a quiz to check their understanding of the book they have read. This will then track your child's reading progress.

As a parent, you can have a log in to the accelerated reader programme to check your child's progress.

MyOn is also linked to Accelerated Reader.



### Information for parents

Annual reports to parents will be sent out at the end of the summer term.

Should you wish to, you will be able to discuss the report with the class teacher, by appointment, either during the afternoon or evening sessions.
