

SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE - How to make Grinch slime!

You will need:

- Cornflour
- Chia seeds
- Green food colouring
- Water
- A small container to hold the slime
- Glitter (optional)



Instructions:

1. Pour a few tablespoons of chia seeds into a small container and cover with water.
2. Leave for roughly one hour. The chia seeds should become thick and gloopy... kind of like fish eggs!

3. Add a few tablespoons of cornflour.
4. Mix well, until you get a thick mixture.
5. Keep adding the cornflour until you get a texture that you like.
6. Add a few drops of green food colouring and again mix well. Add more if you want it darker!
7. Get messy! If you have any glitter, you could also add that into the mixture!



Remember to do this experiment with an adult, and dispose of the slime after use (this is not a long lasting slime).
