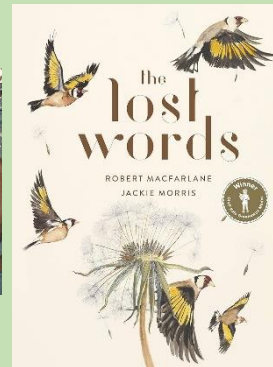

SCIENCE ARTICLE

Experiment - The Volcano of Foam

Carbon Dioxide is a colourless and non-flammable gas. The following experiment shows you how the Carbon Dioxide molecules that are attached to the surface of the Mentos react in fizzy drinks. When put into the drink, a lot of bubbles form and begin to rise to the surface and push the fizzy drink out in a big whoosh!

You will need:

- A packet of Mentos
- A bottle of coke
- A big area (e.g. outside)

1. Open the bottle of coke and put it on the floor in an open area.
2. Put the Mentos into the bottle (the more you put in, the bigger the reaction).
3. Move far away (quickly) and watch the reaction.

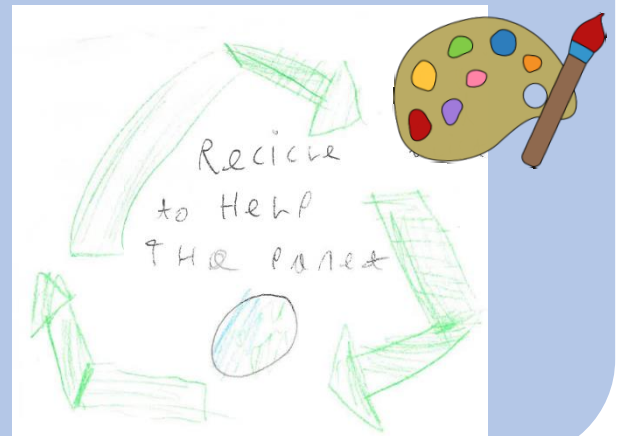
