Pupils cite their new vocabulary and successfully demonstrate its use within a contextual sentence orally. Words include 'treacherous, hogwash, amass, hazard and vicinity.' These words are also visible on the working walls of the classroom which are designed to be useful rather than decorative and indeed, pupils do refer to them both in English and in Maths particularly in upper KS2.

Attainment and Progress

Attainment

Y6 - Predictions 70% reading, 62% writing, 60% maths, 60% SPAG.

ACTUAL – 66% reading, 79% writing (moderated), 62% maths, 55% SPAG Gaps PP/nonPP at ARE - Reading 10% (same as KS1), Writing 18% (gap has grown since KS1 due to higher attainment of nonPP not lack of attainment of PP), maths 5% was 23% at KS1 (gap has closed).

Y5 – All within 10% of KS1 (pre Covid).

Gaps PP/nonPP at ARE – at least 20% in all subjects. Increased since KS1 in writing and maths.

There is 32% PP/nonPP gap in EXS maths, this was 18% at KS1, PRIORITY to close the gap. Pupils have been identified to target.

Progress

Y6 – Progress for all subjects PP/nonPP in line. ALL made outstanding progress this year.

Y5- Reading all 92%, PP 82%, nonPP 97%; writing all 86%, PP 82%, nonPP 97%; maths all 91%, PP 82%, nonPP 100% TARGET 4 boys for reading, 6 boys writing,

Attainment

Y4 – more pupils ARE than AP2, attainment is improving but is still low for all. Gaps nonpp/pp are 20%+ in each subject. No KS1 data available. Target PP pupils especially in reading (less progress made) (22 PP pupils, 7 with PP/SEND, 19 SEND in yr grp).

Y3 – Gaps are closing and more pupils ARE than AP2. However, attainment is still low for all especially in writing in maths.

PP/nonPP gap for ARE is about 10% in writing and maths but larger in reading. No KS1 data available.

Progress

Y4 – Reading all 72%, PP 72%, nonPP 71%; writing all 76%, PP 68%, nonPP 82%; maths all 78%, PP 77%, nonPP 78%. TARGET PP writing

Progess has slowed down in summer term.

Y3 – Reading all 86%, PP 87%, nonPP 96%; writing all 74%, PP 74%, nonPP 74%; maths all 67%, PP 64%, nonPP 70%

Y3 have been split into 3 classes of 20 for September 2022.
